SUBJECT: ASSASSINATION OF THE PRESIDENT

Jim Weihardt, The Milwaukee Sentinel, MU 3-1017, called from Niles, Michigan, and talked to Kemper in my office. He said that his paper had a story that Oswald was in the Milwaukee area at one time. He wondered if we had any information which we could give him concerning this. Kemper told him that he, of course, could not comment. He was asked what basis he had for his information and he said he was trying to run the story down and did not have any specifics.

At 7:00 p. m., Mr. Weihardt called back and apologized to Kemper and said that he had been far too cozy on his first call. He said the story is, that he is at the present time on vacation at Niles, Michigan. He said that about two days before he left Milwaukee, probably about Monday, he had received a tip that an individual using the name of Lee Oswald from Dallas, Texas, had registered at the Fox and Hounds Restaurant on September 16, 1963. The Fox and Hounds Restaurant is located on the outskirts of Milwaukee.
