For record purposes, at 4:45 p.m. today, a woman who identified herself as Mrs. Harry I. Clarkson, 705 Sulky Lane, Rockville, Maryland, telephoned the Bureau and talked to Wick. She said her telephone number is 427-4333. Her given name is Natalie. She explained she is a citizen of the United States but of Russian parentage and speaks Russian fluently.

Mrs. Clarkson told Wick she had wanted to make her phone call a matter of record. She said she has been contacted by the Saturday Evening Post which is doing a story on the background of Oswald. A Mr. G. Trevor Armbrister of the Saturday Evening Post has asked her to telephone the wife of Oswald, Mrs. Marina Nikolaevna Oswald at 2515 West Fifth Street, Irving, Texas, the Russian born wife of Oswald, and speak with her in Russian concerning her husband.

Mrs. Clarkson asked if the FBI had any objection to this telephone call or had any suggestions to make. Wick told Mrs. Clarkson this would be a matter for her own decision.
