ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT JOHN G. KINNEDY, November 22, 1963, DALLAS, TIKAS

RE: FORFERIO SCRSE
Newport, Rhode Island

Carol Cargill, 118 Gorham Avenue, Warwick, Rhode Island, was interviewed on November 24, 1963, but advised the only information she possessed was obtained from Beatrice Reis, 590 Providence Street, West Warwick, Rhode Island.

Beatrice Reis, 590 Providence Street, West
Warwick, Rhode Island, edvised on November 24, 1963, that
some time during his surger of 1962 or 1963, she visited
at the home of a capacit Rector, also at 590 Providence
Street, West Workers, Whode Island, a friend. During the
consider of the west, one Paul Sorse of Newport, Rhode
Island spoke of an intended visit of President Kennedy to
Fort Worth, Texas. Sorse asked Reis in the presence of
only Reis and Restor of her feeling toward the President.
Upon answering that she liked him, Sorse said it would
make no difference as he would get it when he goes there.
Also during the conversation Restor spoke the name Oswald
with no specifics. Reis advised that while she and Restor
had been friends, trouble arose between them terminating
their friendship and she indicated Restor had taken a hostile
attitude toward her since the time of the trouble.

Audrey Cargill, 118 Gorham Avenue, Warwick, Rhose Island, aunt of Reis, advised on November 24, 1963, that the only pertinent information she could furnish was that Beatrice Reiss told her of said instant some time about June, 1963. Cargill stated she was unable to determine from Reis just when the alleged conversation by Sorse and Restor took place, as to whether it had been recent or had taken place in the summer of 1962.

It is noted that during the time of the interview Mrs. Reis was hysterical and was crying. She was very much upset regarding the death of President Kennedy and advised she had been viewing and listening to television and radio broadcasts of the events following the assassination of the President. Reis was uncertain and incoherent about the date the alleged conversation took place and the context of Sorse's conversation, particularly any composition of the word Oswald with the name of the late accused slayer of the President, or any information regarding the background of instant Oswald, or any additional names or pertinent information.

Porfirio Pallem Sorse, also known as Paul, born June 2, 1900 at Valladolid, Phillippine Islands, Certificate of Naturalization No. 8342165, dated August 28, 1961, at Providence, Phode Island, with U.S. Navy service from July 6, 1918 to August 11, 1919, NSN 193-39-71, who resides at 57 Thames Street, Newport, Rhode Island, was interviewed on November 24, 1953. Sorse advised he is currently employed at Christie's Restaurant on Thames Street in Newport as a cock, and was formerly employed in that capacity at the Newport Loter Inn and by Cornelius C. Moore, Attorney and Banker in Newport, and Jelke F. Frazier, Financier, also of Newport. Sorse is also a manufacturer of a product known as Copure, a coconut oil product for application to skin and hair, for which he holds a U.S. patent.

Visiting at her home at 590 Providence Street, West Warwick, on numerous occasions extending over the past few years. He denied making any statements to any one regarding President Kennedy's trip to any place including Texas. Sorse claimed no knowledge of any such trips. He expressed great admiration for President Kennedy and said the only time he ever saw Kennedy was in a crowd at St. Mary's Church, Newport, Rhode Island, in the summer of 1963. He stated he had no other contact, conversation, or viewing of Fresident Kennedy.

Sorse disclaimed any knowledge of or connection with the assassination or Lee Harvey Oswald, or any other persons in Texas. He could furnish no information or

any pertinent names or activities concerning instant assassination. He stated the only time he had been in Texas was in 1926, when employed as a mess boy on a thip entering the harbor of Galveston. Serse advised he has been a resident of Newbort nince about 1937, and has a son, Farl, presently sarving with the United States Air Force in Europe.

Pargaret Restor, 40 Second Feint Road, Warwick, Rhode Island, was deterviewed on November 25, 1963. She advised she formerly lived at 590 Frovidence Street, West Warwick for 4½ years prior to moving to her present address in August, 1963. She advised she has known Paul Sorse for about 21 years, since the time he was the father of her child, Paul Sorse, born out of wedlock, and that Sorse has visited at her home on a number of occasions. She said she has not seen him for about 2 weeks and said that he works as a cook.

Restor spoke highly of Sorse and stated she and her husband had vouched for him when he became a cather of the United States in August, 1961. She advised that to her knowledge Sorse never expressed any ill feeling toward the United States Government or any of its officials. She stated that he served in the U.S. Navy and was honorably discharged. In addition, she advised that to her knowledge Sorse has no criminal background; that he does not mix too much with people, and she know of no friends of Sorse who would have a criminal background.

Restor advised that during some of the visits by Sorse to her home, Beatrice Reis was also present but at no time during any of the visits did Sorse make any statements about or against any governmental official, including the President, while Mrs. Reis was present. Restor stated she does not know anyone with the first or last name of Cswald, and at no time has she referred to that name in any conversation at her home in the presence of either Reis and/or Sorse. She advised she could furnish no information that would be helpful in resolving the reason for the facts surrounding the assassination of President Kennedy.

Francis X. Sullivan, owner and operator of the Newport Motor Inn, 936 West Main Road, Middletown, Rhode Island, advised he has known Paul Sorse for a number of years

him to be employed at Christie's Restaurant, and also at his Motor Inn for the winter season of about November, 1962 through June, 1963, when he left and returned to employment at Christie's. He stated that some time previously he was employed as a cook by Newport Attorney Cornelius Moore, he said that in all the time he had known Sorse he had never known him to be involved in any type of criticinal action or to possess a violent nature in any important of the three he had known to employed as a cook by Newport Attorney Cornelius Moore, he said that in all the time he had known Sorse he had never known him to be involved in any type of criticinal action or to possess a violent nature in any important he throught Sorse to be "mack, mousey." He could furnish no other information regarding Sorse's associates or activities that would be of assistance to this investigation.

Stephen F. Christie, owner and operator of Christie's Restaurant, 351 Thames Street, Newport, Rhode Island, advised on November 25, 1963, Paul Sorse has been currently employed as a cook since December 24, 1960, except for a period of months when he was employed at the Newport Motor Inn, until his re-employment at Christie's in June, 1963. He stated he considered Sorse a quiet person who had not been involved in any type of trouble. He illo said he had not heard him make any statements or take any action advorse to the best interests of the United States, or any of its officials. He said he could furnish no information about Sorse's friends or activities.

Captain Bal Sullivan, in charge of the Detective Division, Newport, Rhode Island Police Department, advised he had known Sorse as a resident of Thames Street, Newport, and as a producer of a coconut call preparation, but he could furnish no information about his friends, associates, or activities. He said that to his knowledge Sorse had not been involved in any type of trouble, and he further stated the records of the Newport Police Department contain no record for Sorse.

John Flanagan, Rhode Island Bureau of Criminal Identification, Providence County Courthouse, Providence, Rhode Island, a central clearinghouse of criminal and arrest records for the State of Rhode Island, advised the files of that office reflect no record for Sorse.
