

Re: Alleged Source of Weapon Used in Assassination

On November 23, 1963, Harry Norton, 34 Edison Green, Dorchester, Massachusetts, advised the Boston Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation that he is very familiar with firearms and based upon information received through radio he is convinced that the weapon, as described, can only be obtained from Klein's Sporting Goods, 227 Washington Street, Chicago, Illinois. The price of this weapon, with a four power scope attached, according to Mr. Norton, is \$20.00, and that the weapon without the scope is priced at \$14.00.

He said the weapon may be ordered by mail and if the order is accompanied by payment the weapon will be immediately forwarded.
