At 9:05 p.m., 11/23/63, Mr. Edward Lacek, 818 Alabama Avenue, SE, Washington, D. C., called and stated that his reason for calling is to be sure that the Government was alert to the danger of so many of our Nation's and world leaders being together at one place at one time. He said this would happen in connection with the late President Kennedy's funeral.

Mr. Lacek said that he had absolutely no information or reason to suspect that anything was going to happen, but said that he did not trust communists and in view of the fact that a communist had killed President Kennedy, he thought that consideration should be given to the possibility that Oswald's action in assassinating President Kennedy was only the first step in a big plot. Mr. Lacek was questioned closely for any specific information he might have and insisted that he had none.
