TWENTYNINE INSTANT OF TIMES REQUIRED TO GET FROM WINDOW ON SIXTH FLOOR OF TEXAS SCHOOL BOOK DEPOSITORY BUILDING WHERE SHOTS WERE FIRED TO FRONT DOOR OF THE TEXAS SCHOOL BOOK DEPOSITORY BY METHODS OF TRAVEL SET FORTH WITH FOLLOWING RESULTS. IT IS NOTED THAT THE TRAVEL WAS DONE IN A FAST WALK EXCEPT IN AREA WHERE AN INDIVIDUAL WOULD HAVE WALKED AT A NORMAL. PACE SO AS NOT TO AROUSE SUSPICION/ ONE. WALKING FROM WINDOW TO STAIRWAY, WALKING DOWN STAIRWAY TO FIRST FLOOR AND WALKING FROM STAIRWAY TO FRONT DOOR, ONE MINUTE FORTYFIVE SECONDS 62-109060-121 WALKING FROM WINDOW TO FREIGHT ELEVATOR WHICH WAS ON TWO. SIXTH FLOOR, RIDING FREIGHT ELEVATOR TO FIRST FLOOR FF ELO 5 1963 END PAGE ONE

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AND WALKING FROM FREIGHT ELEVATOR TO FRONT DOOR, ONE MINUTE, FIFTYFOUR SECONDS.

THREE. WALKING FROM WINDOW TO FREIGHT ELEVATOR, CALLING FREIGHT ELEVATOR FROM FIRST FLOOR TO SIXTH FLOOR, RIDING FREIGHT ELEVATOR FROM SIXTH FLOOR TO FIRST FLOOR, AND WALKING FROM FREIGHT ELEVATOR TO FRONT DOOR, TWO MINUTES THIRTY THREE SECONDS.

FOUR. WALKING FROM WINDOW TO STAIRWAY AND DOWN STAIRWAY
TO FOURTH FLOOR, WALKING FROM STAIRWAY ON FOURTH FLOOR
TO PASSENGER ELEVATOR WHICH WAS ON FOURTH FLOOR, RIDING

DOWN FRONT STAIRS AND WALKED TO FRONT DOOR, WHICH AS
SET FORTH ABOVE TOOK TWO MINUTES TWENTYFIVE SECONDS.
