I wish to bring to your notice the fact that President Kennedy's assassin may have got the blue-print for his crime from a film I saw recently called "The Manchurian Candidate." The circumstances of both are remarkably similar.

In the film, a modern, though fictitious, president of the United States was shot through the head for political reasons as he prepared to make an election speech to a crowd of people. The assassin concealed himself in a room overlooking the crowd where he cooked himself a meal while waiting. He used a rifle with telescopic sights.

The whole event was portrayed very realistically and excitingly and I felt at the time that the censor should perhaps have banned it as being likely to incite a similar crime, especially since the assassin was the hero of the film and believed himself to be liberating America by his act.

I feel very strongly that if it established that Oswald saw this film recently, it might help you to analyze his crime and its motives.
