SUBJECT: ASSASSINATION OF THE PRESIDENT *John F. Kennedy*

Senator Eastland called me and advised he thought there was some information in the files of the Senate Internal Security Subcommittee that indicates that there was a tie between the Southern Conference on Education and the Fair Play For Cuba Committee. He said they were getting this material out and would get it to us. Jay Sourwine called back a little later and talked to Kemper. He said that there was a letter from Robert Williams, who is a Negro who is a fugitive in a kidnaping case in North Carolina and is now in Cuba, to one "Braden," who is with the Southern Conference on Education, thanking Braden for reviewing Williams' book. It was dated 4/23/63.

He said there was another letter dated 9/10/63 from Attorney Conrad Lynn* of New York to Braden which says "Dear Jim." He said he thought they could locate them and would be glad to pass them on.

Kemper also talked to Mr. Ben Mandel, who is on Sourwine's staff and he also reported that a Victor Rabinwitz, the attorney for the Southern Christian Educational Conference, is also attorney for the Fair Play For Cuba Committee. He said this is set forth on page 6 and pages 342 and 343 of the Senate Internal Subcommittee document on Fair Play For Cuba.

He could not at the moment locate the two letters indicated above but he would send over a copy of a letter in which Lynn had referred to Braden and had written "Jim" on the edge of the letter. A copy of this is attached and they are trying to locate the other letter.

The second paragraph which is not germane to the main subject matter is rather interesting in that it refers to the Director. It is as follows:

"At the moment we are overwhelmed in NYC. In other places, such as San Francisco, Cleveland, Detroit, and New Haven, working Negro organizations with our objectives had already been built up. All they had to do was formally affiliate with me at the Park-Sheraton Hotel
