Enclosed for the Bureau are 8 copies of the report of SA DARREL B. CURRIE dated 11/24/63 reflecting interview of PRISCILLA JOHNSON from 11:30 p.m. on 11/23/63 to 1:30 a.m. on 11/24/63. Additional copies are being furnished appropriate offices. Also enclosed for the Bureau is a newspaper article by PRISCILLA JOHNSON which appeared in the Sunday edition of the "Boston Daily Globe", 11/24/63 reflecting her interview with OSWALD.

For the information of the Bureau, in the course of the interview with Miss JOHNSON, she stated that on November 23, 1963, after hearing of President KENNEDY'S death, she telephoned a Mr. OWENS at the Russian Desk in the State Department at Washington, D. C. and told him of her inter-

view with LEE OSWALD in 1959 as she thought this information may possibly be helpful in the investigation of this matter as she had known both President KENNEDY and LEE OSWALD.

Additional copies of this airtel are furnished for Bufile 105-106958, WFO File-105-47870, NY File 105-59587 and Bosfile 105-10333 entitled "UNSUB; Approximately Thirty-Year-Old Female American Tourist of Interest to KGB for Possible Recruitment, IS - R" OO:WFO. This file reflects PRISCILLA JOHNSON possible suspect for the unknown tourist; and Boston Office previously requested to verify Miss JOHNSON's affiliation with the Russian Research Center and her residence at Cambridge, Massachusetts.

During the course of the interview with Miss JOHNSON on 11/23 and 24, 1963, at which time she was very co-operative, she voluntarily furnished background data concerning herself. She stated her father and mother, STUART HOLMES JOHNSON and EUNICE CLAPP JOHNSON, resided at Locust Valley, New York. A brother, STUART HOLMES JOHNSON, Jr., is an employee of Representative EMMANUEL CELLER of New York. Another brother, FRANK COLBY JOHNSON, is employed by the Institute for Space Studies in New York City. She stated that neither of her brothers has ever been a "pilot".

Boston indices contain no other information on PRISCILLA MARY POST JOHNSON.
