Nothing of significance was noted concerning the two marking devices, stamp pad, ball point pen re-fill, Russian-made fountain pen, pipe cleaner, rubberband, artists brush and cigar-shaped flashlight.

Nothing unusual was noted about the book,
printed in the Russian language, item 324.

Pages 1-96, 113-176, 193-208 and 225-282 are
printed on one kind of paper stock that
fluoresces a light tan under UV light.
Pages 97-112 exhibit a darker tan-gray color
when viewed similarly. Pages 177-192
and 209-224 fluoresce a brilliant blue-white.

The possibility cannot be eliminated
that one or more pages of the book have
been treated to serve as sophisticated
carbon for the preparation of secret ink messages.
