ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT SUBJECT: JOHN F. KENNEDY

On 12/11/63, Mr. James J. Rowley, Chief, U. S. Secret Service, while discussing other matters with Liaison Agent Bartlett, commented that the 12/10/63, editions of the "New York Times" and the "Washington Evening Star" carried articles to the effect that the FBI had turned over a "risk list" to the Secret Service in Dallas. These articles further stated that the name of Oswald was not on this list. Mr. Howley indicated that he did not think such a list existed, however, he desired to check to make sure they are not missing something.

After checking on this matter at the Eureau, Bartlett advised Mr. Rowley that the Burcau in Dallas turned over to the Secret Service three items of interest to the Secret Service in connection with the Fresident's visit. These items included the following:

- (1) 10/30/63, information concerning Norman Lec Elkins regarding a threat to the President.
- Service on 11/21/63, entitled Wanted for Treason."
- ...(3) 11/21/63, information concerning picketing and signs to be carried by the pickets - a group known as Mindignant White Citizens Council, Grand Frairie, Texas, headed by Bob Joiner.

Mr. Rowley said he appreciated this information and that the Secret Service Headquarters here was familiar with these three items furnished by the Jurcau.
