On February 13, 1952, Joseph Mosteck, Army Serial No. 110 78 580, appeared at the Washington Field Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation and was interviewed. He stated that he wanted either to talk to Mr. Hoover or to President Truman. He exhibited an undesirable discharge from the Army dated February 12, 1952. He stated that starting in 1945 some international "ring" began following him and he felt his undesirable discharge from the Army was all part of a plot against him.

At the time of this interview Mosteck appeared to be in a highly emotional, unstable state of mind and was advised that the FBI had no jurisdiction in this matter.

On December 9, 1963, Mrs. Charleen Walker, secretary to the Manager of Television Station KPTV, Portland, Oregon, provided a copy of a postal card received by that station on December 6, 1963, bearing the return address of Joseph Mosteck, Sheraton Biltmore Hotel, Providence, Rhode Island, dated December 2, 1963, reading as follows: "The Boys: 1935--1945 President J. F. Kennedy, 35th President of the U.S.A. Killed in action 11/22/63. Only a police action, undercover. Regular Army 11078580."

On December 12, 1963, Lieutenant WALTER FOLEY, Connecticut State Police, Bethany Barracks, Bethany, Connecticut, provided a post card addressed to the Connecticut State Police, New Haven 10, Connecticut, postmarked December 10, 1963 at New Haven, Connecticut, sent by Joseph Mosteck, Sheraton Biltmore Hotel, Providence, Rhode Island, bearing the same message as set forth previously.
