It is noted re LHM does not contain reference
to the anonymous communication received at your office
on 11/22/63 which is described in reairtel. It is felt
this information is necessary for a complete picture of
this matter. Further, it is necessary that Bellah be
specifically questioned concerning the authorship of
the communication bearing his name and address.

Upon resolving the above matter, a complete LHM
should be promptly submitted for possible dissemination
and a copy should be furnished to Secret Service locally.

NOTE:

Dallas received information on 11/26/63 that G. B. Bellah of Louisville, Texas, had been collecting money during the summer of 1963 to investigate President Kennedy. Dallas was also in receipt on 11/22/63 of an anonymous communication signed G. B. Bellah which in part set out various questions inferring President Kennedy was biased in his handling of the Presidential responsibilities. It is not known if this letter is identical with the individual alleged to have been collecting money to investigate the President. Dallas LHM sets forth an interview of Bellah in which he denied having ever collected or assisted in collecting money to investigate President Kennedy. However, Dallas did not include the anonymous communication nor did they specifically question Bellah concerning the anonymous communication. It is felt this matter is of sufficient importance to be furnished to the Secret Service both locally and at the Seat of Government, therefore, Dallas is being requested to re-interview Bellah and specifically resolve the matter concerning the anonymous communication and to submit a LHM incorporating full details of their investigation in this matter for dissemination. It is apparent Bellah does have some animosity for the Kennedys and may have been involved in some action questioning the President's capabilities to handle his position, although he denies same and it is also suspected that he may have authored the anonymous letter sent to Dallas.
