He also forwarded a letter dated 11-23-63

from A. M. Lydon advising that a patient in a veterans hospital some months ago declared that he would kill the President and his whole family.

The paper "Seeds of Doubt" was previously furnished the Bureau by the office of the Attorney General which had received it from Arthur Schlesinger, Jr., Special Assistant to the President. My memo 12-17-63 pointed out that this paper raised a number of questions based upon newspaper versions of the assassination and that one of the authors, Staughton Lynd, had been associated with known communists while the other author, Jack Minnis, had been in contact with the Soviet Embassy in 1958 and had reported this fact to the Bureau. A summary of the information of the inf mation in our file concerning the authors was sent to the Attorne General and has also been furnished to Mr. Lee Rankin, Counsel of the Commission to investigate the assassination.

RECOMMENDATIONS

1. Inasmuch as the AG and Mr. Lee Rankin have been given a summary of background information concerning the authors of "Seeds of Doubt," it is recommended that the attached letter and memo be sent to the Assistant AG of the Criminal Division furnishing him with similar information.

Lydon which refers to statements allegedly made by a patient at a Veterans Administration hospital.
