In addition, the sender refers to a "greatest Eoax" with regard to atomic nuclear power, and refers to one Dr. G. P. Malalasekbra who he characterizes as President of the World Fellowship of Buddhists and one of the "greatest religious figure who has ever lived." It is possible this communication was authored by a religious fanatic or a mentally disturbed person, however, in view of the allegations relating to the assassination of President Kennedy, it is felt reasonable logical efforts should be made to check this information out.
