Page 24033. Congressman E. B. Eason, (D) Mississippi, submitted a newsletter written by Congressman J. B. Bennett, (D) Mississippi, dealing with the assassination of President Kennedy. Mr. Bennett stated "We continue to read much about an alleged 'growing wave of intolerance, intolerance, bigotry, and race hatred.' This should not go unchallenged. . . . Everyone from the FBI to the Dallas Police Department is convinced that Oswald, and he alone, planned the shooting. . . . There is not the slightest shred of evidence that it was associated with or sprung from an alleged wave of racial hatred or racial bigotry."
