CAMILLE DAVID BRUNET;
GOVERNOR JOHN CONNALLY - VICTIM

On December 27, 1963, Mr. ROBERT E. DILDY, Governor's Manion, Austin, Texas, advised that on December 25, 1963, CAMILLE DAVID BRUNET, furnishing his name and telephone number in Los Angeles, California, called the Governor's Mansion in Austin, Texas, and asked to speak to Governor CONNALLY. DILDY stated he refused permission for BRUNET to speak to Governor CONNALLY and BRUNET spoke incoherently and asked questions concerning the Ku Klux Klan. DILDY stated that BRUNET was obviously intoxicated; however, he made no threats during the telephone conversation.
