Mr. Malley called from Dallas this morning to advise that the check of the assassination scene arranged by the President's Commission had gone off as scheduled. The street was tied-up from 6 a.m. to 1 p.m. and there were some traffic problems after 11 a.m. He said except for a few odds and ends, the matter has been completed and he will be returning to Washington this evening.

He said that there is a possibility that Commission members Warren, Boggs, Ford and Russell will come down to Dallas next weekend to actually see for themselves the scene of the assassination, inasmuch as a visit to the actual scene appears to clarify in the minds of Commission members questions which have arisen during the study of the event.
