## THREAT AGAINST PRESIDENT WILLIAH TUHWEY

THREAT AGAINST PRESIDENT

On May 29, 1964, CHARLES A. DOLLINGER, 302 F.

Jay St., Newton, North Carolina, telephonically advised the Ealtimore Office of the FBI that he is currently staying at Holiday Inn, Reisterstown Road, Baltimore County, Haryland. DOLLINGER informed that on the evening of May 28, 1964, he engaged in conversation with WILLIAM TUMMEY who resides either on Henry Alden Rd. or Church Lane. Baltimore, Maryland, and is possibly in the contracting Lane, Baltimore, Maryland, and is possibly in the contracting business. The conversation took place at Spaulding Bar on Reisterstown Road and in argument that involved the assassina-tion of President KERKEDY, TURKEY said President KERKEDY should have been shot. DOLLINGER stated he told TURKEY should have been shot. DOLLINGER stated he told TUBREY no one could shoot a man, particularly a President. TUBREY and said he could and would shoot a President and could and would shoot President JCHHSON, if necessary,

DOLLINGER could not explain how he had obtained

DOLLIKGER could not explain how he had obtained addresses of TUHKEY but said TUHKEY gave him his name.
