Dear Sir:

On April 8, 1964, I took the liberty to write to the Office of the Attorney General of the United States of America. Fate must have willed it so that this information of interest to you and your next of kin did not get to your hands.

Only recently, that is on March 19, 1964, I was given an opportunity to inform the Office for the Protection of the Constitution (of West Germany) as to certain measures presumably taken by the countries of the Eastern Bloc - in this specific case, the German Democratic Republic - to stage a concerted action.
