I'm glad you are with good people also.

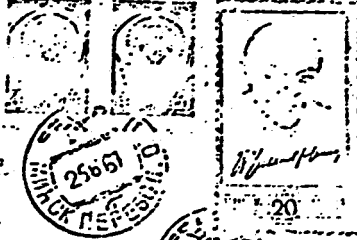

Red Cross on the line here, and told them  
about it; they will send someone out  
to the home to see you, when they do  
please tell them everything they want to  
know, so I am trying to secure an  
Early (hardship) discharge, in order to  
help you since a discharge is only  
rarely given. but if they know  
you are unable to support yourself  
then they will release me from the
