Enclosed for your assistance are two copies of a self-explanatory communication from our Dallas Office dated June 16, 1964, incorporating the identities of Texas School Book Depository Building employees who were printed by this Bureau. You were previously advised this project was to be limited to those employees who would have had occasion to handle the cartons in question at the specific request of Mr. Roy S. Truly, Warehouse Superintendent.

The fingerprints and palm prints of those

The fingerprints and palm prints of those employees listed in the onclosed Dallas communication were compared with the nineteen latent fingerprints and the six latent palm prints proviously developed on the cardboard cartons marked "A," "B," "C" and "D" and no identifications were effected. The prints of these employees printed by this Burcau are being rotained in the files of this Burcau's Identification Division.

ReBuairtel 6-11-64, and your airtel 6-16-64. This is being furnished for your information to furnish you the results of the Identification Division's comparison of the major case prints with the leads developed in this matter.

NOTE: The Commission by letter 6-9-64, reiterated a previous request to determine the identity of persons leaving latent prints on cartons near where Oswald fired the assassination shots. The most recent request indicated that all appropriate methods should be used to do this job which would have necessitated the taking of major case prints of all Texas School Book Depository Building (TSBD) employees. Roy S. Truly, Warehouse Superintendent, of the TSBD when advised of this procedure strongly objected and requested the taking of prints be limited to those employees who would have had occasion to handle the cartons. Burean letter have had occasion to handle the cartons. Bureau letter 6-16-64, to the Commission pointed out Truly's objections and indicated we would not go beyond this point unless advised to the contrary by the Commission.

Dallas by airtel 6-16-64, submitted a letterheadmemorandum indicating that 12 employees might have handled the cartons and the major case prints were submitted and compared. No identification was effected. This concludes our inquiry.
