NOTE:

Since the assassination we have received numerous reports of individuals who allegedly predicted the assassination of President Kennedy. Most of these individuals are alleged to have unusual powers of extrasensory perception. One specific instance investigated by this Bureau was an allegation that Jeane Dixon of Washington, D. C., who is associated with the James L. Dixon Real Estate Company, had been discussed in a magazine article as having predicted not only the assassination of President Kennedy, but having predicted the deaths of other notables. Through investigation we determined that the article referred to was in the 10-63 issue of "Fate" magazine.

This magazine caters to stories of extrasensory perception and strange happenings not readily explainable. In the article by Dixon she predicted the deaths of Supreme Court Justice Frank Murphy, UN Secretary General Dag Hammarskjold, President Franklin Roosevelt and President Kennedy.
