SUBJECT: Anonymous Letter

I am forwarding with this memo an anonymous PMB (prisoners mail box) letter mailed from the U.S. Penitentiary, Leavenworth, Kansas, for your disposition.

The anonymous writer implicates "a man named [redacted] at Leavenworth. A check of our inmate files reveals only one [redacted] presently serving time at that penitentiary. He is a [redacted] Reg. No. [redacted] serving [redacted] months for Violation of the Dyer Act. A review of [redacted] file does not disclose anything of particular significance except possibly that he is from Texas and a classification study in 1961 indicated that "He is openly bitter toward the state, and federal authorities and society in general".
