Enclosed is one true copy of a letter written by George D. Stewart, Box 300 Wichita Falls, Texas, Texas State Hospital, received at the Bureau. The letter was postmarked July 11, 1964.

Stewart makes various allegations concerning conditions at the hospital and it appears he is confined there as a mental patient. However, included among his comments which are noted on the second page, he makes reference to the "Chief Engineer of President Kennedy's assassinator."

Contact officials of the hospital to determine circumstances why Stewart has been committed. Subsequently, if he is a mental patient, the information from official records plus Stewart's letter should be incorporated into a subsequent report.

Based on information furnished, George Dewey Stewart was not identified in Bureau files.

Stewarts of England and also commented he was arrested for various charges and wasn't allowed to see the charge. He has complained of mistreatment at Texas Hospital where he is located claiming he has been held a prisoner since April 18, 1961. He rambled on considerable length indicating an FBI undercover man is needed at the hospital and also an undercover U. S. Postal Inspector. He also made comments concerning the President's assassination. Dallas has been instructed to check with hospital officials, determine if Stewart can be interviewed and if so, the interview should be restricted only to the assassination matter.
