**NOTE FOR SACs OKLAHOMA CITY  
DALLAS  
AND LEGAL ATTACHE, TOKYO**

Enclosed for Oklahoma City, Dallas and Legal Attache Tokyo is a copy of the afore-mentioned communication bearing Martin's name dated 7-17-64.

Atsuyuki Sassa is a Japanese Police Superintendent who visited FBI Headquarters on 3-5-64, and was afforded a special tour of the Bureau. The article written by Troelstrup in the "U. S. News and World Report" contained numerous inaccuracies and incorrectly implied that Sassa participated in our investigation of the assassination. The article, while quite favorable to the Bureau, was prepared after Troelstrup participated in an informal group discussion in Japanese attended by Sassa and other Japanese police officers. The Bureau has received signed statements in which Troelstrup admits there were errors in his article and that he was wrong in saying that Sassa was assigned to our investigation. The President's Commission has been furnished details of this matter.

**NOTE:** This is the 21st letter to the Commission on Martin. SAC Letter 64-23B dated 4-23-64, alerted the field to her continuing campaign of vilification of the Director and the FBI.

In Martin's most recent letter, which was directed to Mr. Sassa and a copy furnished to the Bureau, Martin comments on the article appearing in the magazine and starts out with "I am sorry you don't understand the questions raised concerning the investigation of the assassination..." Martin endeavors to show where her "superior" understanding negates Sassa's opinions on the time it took to fire the assassination weapon and other matters. She concludes by stating that Sassa should not put too much faith in the FBI.
