ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT

MISCELLANEOUS - INFORMATION CONCERNING

Enclosed for Cleveland and Dallas are copies of a letter received from Edw. H. Tweddell dated 7/15/64, which is self-explanatory.

You are instructed to promptly contact Tweddell, acknowledge receipt of his letter to the Director and specifically interview him concerning his statement that he knows there is more than one person involved in the assassination.

You should not endeavor to answer the other provocative questions raised by Tweddell, however, you should insure that he is advised this matter has received intensive investigation by the FBI and that the results are furnished to the President's Commission inquiring into the facts of the assassination.

No information identifiable with Tweddell could be located in Bureau files.

The results of interview and any other necessary investigation should be incorporated in appropriate inserts for transmittal to Dallas the office of origin. Furnish one copy of results to the Bureau and 25 copies of inserts to Dallas.

Handle promptly as President's Commission may terminate inquiry at early date.

Tweddell's letter is provocative in nature implying obvious questions raised since the assassination have not been answered, which is not the case. It appears Tweddell wrote this letter impulsively after reading an article on the assassination in a local Akron, Ohio, newspaper. It is very doubtful he has any information of value, however, in view of his statement it is felt we have the responsibility to interview him in line with interviews conducted in similar matters. The results of this investigation will be appropriately reported by Dallas and furnished to the President's Commission.
