Attached is a copy of a letter sent by Mrs. [REDACTED] Randolph Hills, Rockville, Maryland, to the Honorable Governor JOHN CONNOLLY, Executive Mansion, Austin, Texas. This letter was furnished to the San Antonio Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation on July 16, 1964, by [REDACTED] Administrative Assistant, Executive Department, State of Texas, Austin, Texas. Mr. TEMPLE advised that he had furnished copies of the attached letter to the United States Secret Service in Austin, Texas.

At the time a previous similar communication had been received by the Governor of Texas from Mrs. SHAFFER, the following information was developed concerning her:

On July 15, 1964, [REDACTED] Clerk, D.C. Credit Bureau, Washington, D.C., advised records of that Bureau reflected [REDACTED] of [REDACTED] Rockville, Maryland, has been [REDACTED] to the D. C. Credit Bureau since July, 1961. [REDACTED] is married to [REDACTED] and they have been at the [REDACTED] address since [REDACTED]. They are buying their home there. The [REDACTED] formerly lived at [REDACTED], Washington, D.C. Mrs. [REDACTED] is a white female, approximately 50 years of age. Mrs. [REDACTED] is employed as a payroll clerk by the National Institutes of Health, Bethesda, Maryland.

On July 16, 1964, [REDACTED] Staff Accountant, Accounting and Auditing Section, National Institutes of Health, Bethesda, Maryland, advised that he is the immediate supervisor of Mrs. [REDACTED]. Mrs. [REDACTED] has been employed as a payroll clerk since January, 1957. [REDACTED] stated that during the past two years Mrs. [REDACTED] has been on extended sick leave and leave without pay and will shortly be retired because of medical disability. He added that at one time she was a valued and reliable employee but now appears to be an extremely emotionally upset woman.
