ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT

A search of the indices of the Hilwaukee Office of the PBI on July 24, 1964 failed to reveal any information concerning an organization known as "Americans" or any letters similar in nature to the one addressed to Mr. J. Edgar Hoover and stating that President Johnson knows the gangsters and why John F. Kennedy was murdered, which letter was signed. Americans and postmarked July 19, 1964 at Kenosha, Wisconsin.

On July 24, 1964 sources of information of the Milwaukee Office, who are acquainted with Subversive Activities in the Wisconsin area and have furnished reliable information in the past, advised that they had no information concerning the origin of the above mentioned letter.

On July 27, 1964 Lorraine Ferraros Identification Clerk, Bureau of Identification, Hilwaukee Police Department, advised that the records of that department contained no information regarding an organization known as "Americans."

On July 27, 1964 Lt. Orville Livingston, handwriting expert, Hilwaukce Police Department, examined the letter in question and advised that he could not identify it with any other known handwriting contained in the records of the Hilwaukee Police Department nor was it similar in nature to any other letter contained in the records of the department.

On July 29, 1964 Captain Arthur J. Riley, Detective Bureau,
