On August 6, 1964, the following telegram was
received by the Federal Bureau of Investigation,
Washington, D. C., from Detroit:

"Have information I wish to disclose
regarding the Kennedy assassination contact
Roosevelt Hotel Room 222 Registered Nurse
telephone 1-1631 Julie Larson Holmbeck."

✓ Mrs. Julie Larson Holmbeck was interviewed at
her residence, Room 222, Roosevelt Hotel, Detroit, Michigan
on August 7, 1964, by Special Agents Edward G. Astfalk and
✓ Melville H. Shannon. Mrs. Holmbeck detailed a rambling,
disjointed and incoherent story which, in essence, stated
that for the past two years she has been hearing loud
voices which have caused her to continually move about
throughout the United States. These voices are always
telling her to "get out of here". She stated that several
weeks before President Kennedy's assassination, these
voices spoke to her in Italian and told her that her son was
going to be killed under a viaduct. She has been concerned
about this prediction by the voices and decided that this
was information which should be brought to the attention of
the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

Mrs. Holmbeck stated that she did not have any
other information to furnish concerning the assassination
of President Kennedy.
