From conversations with [REDACTED] during this visit, [REDACTED] formed the opinion that [REDACTED] was a "far right extremist" in the political sphere. This opinion was the result of some of the statements made by [REDACTED], which are as follows:

[REDACTED] claimed to know for a fact that both Harvey Oswald and Jack Ruby were communist agents.

[REDACTED] stated that President Johnson and former President Kennedy were tools and sympathizers of the communist movement.

[REDACTED] stated that President Kennedy was ordered assassinated by the communists because he was "getting out of line." He also stated that Jack Ruby was ordered by the communists to kill Harvey Oswald.

[REDACTED] advised that the above comments were not made in one discussion but in several discussions over the two-day period.

[REDACTED] stated that he would meet with "some people" in California with whom he had been in contact through correspondence and these people knew "what was going on."

According to [REDACTED] is very intelligent and during all discussions [REDACTED] was coherent and rational, and he feels that [REDACTED] really believes the statements he made. [REDACTED] further advised that [REDACTED] informed him that if he was interested he would send him some literature which would prove that what he, [REDACTED], said was true.
