New York is instructed to attempt to locate and interview E. R. Keiber, 5320 Avenue L, Brooklyn, New York; F. W. Bolesta, 1713 Madison Street, Brooklyn, New York and Frank Kowalski, 6209 39th Avenue, Woodside, Long Island, to identify the writer of the anonymous communications furnished to you.

Your airtel 8-21-64, indicated Dr. Ladvised none of the individuals listed in the anonymous communications were presently patients or ever had been patients at the Kings Park State Hospital, Kings Park, Long Island. However, it was not indicated whether any of the individuals listed were employees. Therefore, to logically conclude this matter, you are instructed to make appropriate inquiries of the personnel office to determine if any of the individuals listed are employees and if any are, they should be interviewed in an attempt to identify the anonymous writer.

You are also instructed to prepare a LHM incorporating the anonymous letters, the results of the Laboratory examination and the results of your investigation and furnish this memorandum to the Bureau. No inserts will be necessary for Dallas in this matter as dissemination to the President's Commission will be handled by the Bureau.

RE: ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT KENNEDY

The Bureau has received information that the President's Commission will be concluding their investigation in the immediate future and this matter should be handled expeditiously.

NOTE: Bureau received 2 anonymous letters one of which was furnished by Walter Winchell containing a list of some 25 individuals who reside in various parts of the United States and who may be employees or patients at Kings Park State Hospital, Long Island, New York. It is alleged these people have knowledge of the assassination and one of the letters claimed that Oswald was not the only one involved in the assassination. Several of the names in the anonymous communications were repetitious and the writer claimed individuals named are ex members of the United States Coast Guard who served in World War II. Kings Park State Hospital is a mental institution and it is possible the writer is a former member of the United States Coast Guard. A check was made with officials of Kings Park State Hospital. However, the names were not identified as patients.

The Laboratory concluded that both letters were written by the same person. To logically conclude this matter, New York is being instructed to conduct additional investigation restricted to the New York area only in an attempt to identify the writer.
