Reference Dallas report of SA Robert P. Cemberling 8-28-64 captioned as above.

A review of referenced report has been made at the Bureau and the following clarifying corrections have been made. Also certain amended pages will be necessary and offices submitting amended pages furnish these to the Bureau, ten copies; Dallas, four copies; New Orleans, one copy, and San Antonio, one copy.

Page 24 quotation marks were inserted following the period at the end of the last sentence.

Page 28, Paragraph 2, Line 13 beginning with "Somebody has," at the end of this sentence quotation marks were moved to follow the period.

Page 60, unless advised to the contrary by Dallas, Paragraph 4, Line 5 first word "the" is being changed to

On Page 97 through 103 an interview conducted by Orleans Office with Emerson Varnor Price, Jr., was revealed.

Price, [redacted] identified an associate, Jimmy Nash, Page 101, who was alleged to have observed Lee Harvey Oswald's name in Price's notebook prior to the time it was stolen. Dallas should submit an amended Page 103, which should indicate additional investigation is being conducted to locate, identify, and interview Jimmy Nash to further resolve and verify this matter. Dallas should insure all leads are handled expeditiously, if not already handled. Results are to be contained in a subsequent report under the Assassination captioned.

Dallas should give consideration for disseminating of information concerning Nash to appropriate military authorities. It was noted Nash has associated with Price, [redacted] and has a military reserve obligation with the National Guard.

Page 119 reveals the prosecutive opinion of the Assistant United States Attorney, B. H. Timmons, Jr. Although Timmons' title and judicial district are revealed on other pages of the report, this same information should be included on Page 119, and an amended page is to be submitted.

Dallas is also instructed to advise if in Paragraph one on Page 121, Line 4, Liverpool "B" and on Page 122 under item Q3, Liverpool "B" are correct. It appears "B" could be "E" as the letter involved which was received by Mr. Henry H. Vago, Dallas County District Attorney, was mailed from Liverpool, England.

Los Angeles who has not received a copy of referenced report, Page 6 is an insert prepared by Los Angeles (89-75) initials "LH;DHA" regarding George Dewey Baucum. An amended insert is necessary as Paragraph 2 should reveal names of one or more mental institutions in which Baucum has been a patient. In addition, his diagnosed mental condition should be attributed to a specific official of the Veterans Hospital, Santa Fe, California.

In order that the referenced report can be furnished to the Commission, this matter must be handled expeditiously.

NOTE

Referenced report was received at Bureau August 31, 1964, and has been reviewed. Certain corrections have been made at the Bureau, however, amended pages are necessary prior to dissemination. In connection with Emerson Varner Price he alleged he picked up Oswald on one occasion and at that time Oswald wrote his name in his notebook in regard to hiring Price to take him to New Mexico or Mexico along with two other men. Jimmy Nash was alleged to have seen this notebook. This matter should be resolved.
