Dear Mr. Oswald:

I am pleased to inform you that the Embassy is now in a position to take final action on your wife's visa application. Therefore, you and your wife are invited to come to the Embassy at your convenience when your wife has gathered the documents listed in the attached Form TSI-869.

The Embassy has on file two copies of your wife's birth certificate and one copy of her marriage certificate. Therefore, she need bring only one more copy of her marriage certificate, three photographs, an X-ray, serological analysis and certification of mumps inoculation.

As you were notified previously, three photographs of your daughter and a copy of her birth certificate will also be necessary for the Consular Report of Birth and the endorsement of your passport.

As I mentioned in my previous letter, you should request that your wife (and also your daughter if possible) be designated as mail points in your Soviet exit visa.

Should notify the Embassy when to expect you.
