On the late evening of October 19, 1964, an individual identifying himself as [REDACTED] communicated by telephone with a representative of the New Orleans Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. This individual stated that he planned to kill President Johnson as soon as he delivers his inaugural address. [REDACTED] said he was a member of the United States Marine Corps for twenty years and had received a medical discharge. He claimed he knew "the real story behind the assassination of President Kennedy."

When [REDACTED] was questioned concerning his identity and for the purpose of obtaining further background information concerning himself, he stated that any information concerning himself could be obtained from Doctor [REDACTED] [REDACTED] Veterans Administration Hospital, New Orleans, Louisiana.

[REDACTED] terminated the conversation by disconnecting the telephone.

The files of this office contain no prior information concerning [REDACTED]

The above information was furnished orally to Receptionist Jill LeBlanc, United States Secret Service, New Orleans, at 10:30 AM, October 20, 1964, in the absence of a Secret Service Agent being in the office.
