Re Los Angeles airtel to the Bureau, 10/9/64.

For the information of the Bureau, GEORGE CECIL THOMSON, 1528 Canada Boulevard, Glendale, California, has contacted the Los Angeles Office telephonically subsequent to the submission of captioned airtel, reiterating his belief that OSWALD is not guilty as concluded by the Warren Commission. He stated he now feels WALTER JENKINS was guilty of President KENNEDY's assassination.

He telephonically contacted the Los Angeles FBI Office, on October 26, 1964, and reiterated to SA PHILLIP B. DEILY his belief of the innocence of OSWALD. He stated he had reviewed the Warren Commission Report and has noted several things that warrant additional investigation. Specifically, he has conducted certain research in connection with the photograph of OSWALD on page 20 of the Report and has concluded the photograph is a fake; he has concluded similarly with regard to the photograph referred to on page 44 of the Report. He wants to be answered as a private citizen with regard to an evaluation of the material he has submitted and advised of what action is being taken in the way of additional investigation.

THOMSON has advised that he has an employee of his office named OSCAR GRUNBERG who is from South America and has a rich cousin in South America. He considered GRUNBERG to be completely loyal to the United States but he wanted GRUNBERG's name to be in the possession of the FBI in view of his foreign connections; further, that he considers GRUNBERG to be a loyal and honest employee. THOMSON stated he sometimes thinks the Russians are reading his mind because some of the things that he thinks in solitude he later reads in the newspapers.

THOMSON was thanked for his information and was advised that results of FBI investigation are confidential by law. He was assured his observations and comments would be made known to the appropriate authorities.
