Assassination of president John FITZGERALD MEASLES, NOVEKRER 22, 1963

Mrs. Marguerite C. Oswald, 4029 Byers, Fort Worth, Texas, New Criesns address Room 474, Royal Oriegns Hotel, wother of Lee Karvey Cavald, telephonically contacted the New Orleans Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, on July 21, 1986. Mrs. Carald advised that she had discovered that Krs. Thelma Filloz who resides on Louisiana Avenue, New Orleans, Louisiana, and who is employed as a beauty operator at Harold Kethod, New Orleans, has never been interviewed by any of the investigating agencies concerning her knowledge of Lee Harvey Oscald and herself. Mrs. Oscald stated that Mrs. Willoz is a long time friend of hers and knew both Lee Harvey and herself intimately.

Brg. Gavald advised that Mrs. Willox has a daughter named Anna May, who is married to a Cuban National. Mrs. Oswald related that Arma May's husband was from a very prominent and wealthy family in Cuba and after Pidel Castro assumed was a second power in Cuba, Anna May's husband and his family were stripped of all their wealth and property by the Castro Government. Ers. Oswald stated that Kre. Willoz may have discussed Lee Harvey Cstald with Anna Kay who in turn may have related the informa-tion to her bushand. Wrs. Oswald stated that this may have had some connection with the assassination case and felt that Mrs. Willez should be interviewed in connection with the assassination of President John F. Kennedy.
