Writers Market "56" lists your organization and does so in
one or the kind of material you either welcome or solicit or
consider for publication. With knowledge of this fact in
mind, I invite your commentary in behalf of a manuscript or docu-
mentary I have myself authored and compiled, an author and a
manuscript, as the case would be, describable in the following
paragraphs.--

A combined documentary, scientific and technological report
of criticism or indictment composed of a system of articles and
correspondence accumulated over a period of months in some cases
and years in others.

A manuscript compiled and authored by an individual whose
accumulation of knowledge probably embraces the most contro-
versial scientific and technological problems and issues of our
time.

A manuscript which shoulders the responsibility of openly
and specifically attacking the most delusory yet sub-
tly interpretationally purposeful system of lies, frauds and con-
siderable trash etc. in the nation's history; an attack aimed at
all major agencies the system itself has been deliberately
selected to protect.

An individual whose home has been the object of an
unrelieved visit by F. B. I. agents as a consequence of the
submitting and delivering of articles of the kind included in the
manuscript.

An individual who can speak of facts and issues so openly,
the nation's bureaucrats and many others in addition would be
willing to go to any lengths in suppressing him and forcing a
nugatory wasting of his time.

A manuscript whose measure of damage over involves the
nation's legal profession, General Telephone Co., Brookhaven
National Laboratories, American Association for the Advancement
of Science and a publication entitled *Journal of Atomic Sci-
ence* and *CBS*.

A commentary based on claims of the greatly appreciable
danger presented such losses.

... manuscrity is access of more than a few as measure of
unpublished human interest and intelligence.

A work of relative brevity (less than the equivalent of 200
written eight sheets) but one so broad yet detailed or de-
tailed and so elementary yet sophisticated or content it can
fail to treat of J. F. Os. and U. L. etc. and apparitions etc.
as the practical traits of but one of the easily describable
branches of overall diversified engineering encompassed by an
overall scientific and technological "miracle creed".

A work authored by an individual whose knowledge of space,
cosmology, quantum mechanics, matter, relativity, cause
and effect, action and reaction etc. has been accumulated over
a period of decades and not mere months or years.

A manuscrity compiled and authored by an individual who has
never possessed any literary ability; but, a three-lane manuscrity
so easily readable (photocopies typewritten pages) and so capable
of being understood (elementary terminology etc.) it could be
understood and assimilated by a pre-high-school student.

Documentary based on knowledge, experience and know-how
confident, overwhelming and probably certain of its ground
that the author can afford to publish and openly (publicly and
privately except insofar as the security of the author would become
known to the public in any significant way) distribute thousands
of copies in which he details on the charge that the Presidencies
of the United States is a cover and a falsehood. A Documentary
of knowledge etc. so certain of its ground that the author
cannot justify this yet not be called to account for such charge
by any federal agency.

An individual whose wife and family oblivious of the
individual involved here even to this day. An individual
whose wife, relatives and friends to this day remain totally
oblivious of...

2. The identity of the individual (myself) who delivered
the thousands of articles referred to in paragraph 5
and this despite their having been produced and dis-
seminated from time to time since 1937.

3. All of the correspondence contained by the manuscrity
and later issued back and forth between myself and the
agent possession etc. etc.

4. The views of P. D. C. etc. to my home during 1934.

5. The existence of the 100,000 stock and the nature

6. The range and quality of scientific etc. infor-

7. The etc. etc. etc.

A manuscript reflecting the objectives of an author whose
personal and direct servile knowledge & whose direct
personal experience with etc. etc. medical and educational
etc. or similar areas of technology could not even be evaluated
by a publisher or customer or supervisor etc. etc. let alone
estimated by a research scientist or engineer etc. in India
whose knowledge and experience in such matters covers a
period of time measured in decades rather than months or years.
An individual whose knowledge and experience in such matters is
numerous.

A manuscript which reveals the nature of a few of the sub-
tly unlimited objections of opposition capable of discouraging
any effort of an individual in our cause opposition
capable of rendering impossible the problem of getting to the
point with the kind of written word he could understand in
such matters.

A commentary authored by an individual whose knowledge can
underwrite the accuracy and authenticity of every single
feature contained therein; but a commentary
does, up to the present, purposefully avoid treating of all
the scientific and technological details (operational prin-
ciples, physical laws etc.) of the scientific and techno-
logical instruments otherwise dealt with in the commentary.

A manuscript which supplies the all-important key to any
understanding of the most important motto behind
all and international political objectives, plans etc.
in high places in our day.

A manuscript which pulls no punches in connection with the
considerable breach between knowledge on the one hand and
religion and religious belief; on the other. But a manuscript
authored by an individual who, to take the case for theologians
up to the present, does not even know what they are
talking about or the element of irreconcilability.

A manuscript which supplies the all-important key to an
understanding of how and why it happens that the very ones who
dictate and formulate policy at high levels cannot even
say prove or even suggest that they really know what they are
doing or what they are doing with what they are doing etc. (the element
of irreconcilability).

The author borrows the above classification of the man-
uscript.

Notes class 3. Obviously the author's prior decision
to handle a manuscript of the type indicated could easily
be nullified by a host of excuses etc. none of which would be
as logically accurate. Obviously he could even have committed
such a foolish error to the point where nevertheless agrees

... and the manuscript. For he could be quite familiar with
... and you some of the material contained in it. This was
... always indicated in paragraphs 2, 3, 4, 7, 10 etc. of this
... letter you hold. Worse than that, the reason why he would refuse
... to publish could arise out of respect for considerations having
... nothing whatever to do with excuses or pretenses or reasons
... on his part at all.

Having presented you with a rough approximation of what you
... will expect of my manuscript and commentary, I do solicit you,
... a yes or no answer to the question "would you consider pub-
... lishing a manuscript of the kind I describe?" Obviously, your
... final decision could not avoid being based on your appraisal
... of my reaction to one or more salient aspects of the manuscript.
... It is the ones indicated in paragraphs 5, 6, 8, 10, 15,
... and 19, say, of this letter you hold. That is to say, your
... final (your answer or "no" to the question) could not be based
... on the kind of nonsense or idiocy, say, terminating in some such
... phrase as "it does not meet the needs of our particular program".

A published work containing the kind of information, accu-
... racy and reference etc. indicated could not possibly avoid
... being an intensely saleable item provided that a publisher would
... offer an honest desire to see have it. In fact, an author
... has of underwriting the accuracy of his more salient contents
... can be said to have authored a novel which is of inestimable and
... commanding proportions.

Now, commentaries requested in the first paragraph does not
... amount to more than a one word "yes" or "no" comment. It
... is merely and only your answer to the question of whether
... you would publish this work despite its obvious content and
... intrinsic reference, a question which does not necessarily
... indicate that a "yes" answer will give you the opportunity
... to publish.

J. H. Sheldon and J. Lester of Carlton Press, New York City,
... examined the manuscript and have announced that it should
... be published and that their organization would be privileged
... to do so.
