CLAY L. SHAN ASSASSINATION C.7 PRESIDENT KUNIDY

The St. Paul "Dispatch" of March 18, 1967, in a by-line article, reported that CLAY L. SHAW, a New Orleans businessman cupected to stand trial on a charge of conspiring to kill Incoident JOHN F. KENNEDY, visited St. Paul at least on one occasion and was acquainted with local executives.

The "Dispatch" learned that SHAV, as managing director of the International Trade Hart, a New Orleans business group, was a member of a delegation to St. Paul in 1956 to discuss effects on Hississippi River traffic due to the proposed St. Lawrence Seaway. This meeting followed a visit to New Orleans of a delegation of St. Paul businessnon, including JOSEPH L, SHIELY, Sr., a St. Paul contractor.

SHIELY, who was contacted at Fort Lauderdale, Florida, said the charges against SUAW of allegedir manpiring with the late LDE MARVEY OSWALD to kill KENNEDY are "ridiculous" and "the efforts of a public seeking district attornoy."

"SHAW is too big a man to be connected with anything like this," SHIELY said. "This is purely a constional effort by GARRISON. The politics of Louisiana are ridiculous to start with."

SHIELY last saw SHAW about two yoars ago when he was an honorary pallbearer at a funeral in Now Orleans and ho remembers SHAW as "an affable executive who was easy to talk with."
