The photograph in question was printed in a volume of the "Hearings Before the President's Commission on the Assassination of President Kennedy." It is discussed in the Report of the President's Commission. CIA furnished us the photograph at the time of the assassination as possibly being Oswald. It was not. It was this same photograph that was exhibited to Oswald's mother on 11/23/63 with the question of whether or not she knew the man. did not, but after Oswald's death and Jack Ruby's arrest, she stated the photograph that had been shown her was of Ruby. Of course, she was incorrect. It was in this connection that the Commission discussed the photograph in 6240 its Report.
