On April 20, 1967, ASAC J. Sylvester of the New Orleans Office called. He advised that he was sending a teletype to the Bureau detailing information received by him from a personal acquaintance, one [redacted] a reporter for the New Orleans "States Item". According to Sylvester, [redacted] determined that Gordon Novel, who has been charged by District Attorney James Garrison, now claims to have been employed by the Central Intelligence Agency. Sylvester advised that his source had requested that his name be kept confidential. Sylvester also advised that his source indicated that his newspaper was considering publishing a story about this matter.
