Mr. Lacour together with his wife and family met briefly with the Director on the morning of 6/9/67. Mr. Lacour's family consists of his wife, Gloria, and his children, twin girls, Angeliqne and Adrienne (13), Gloria Anne (11), Louis, Jr., (8), and Vallery (6).

Mr. Hoover thanked Mr. Lacour for his cooperation in New Orleans, and Mr. Lacour indicated that excellent relations exist between his office and the New Orleans Field Division. Mr. Hoover emphasized the need to work together as a team.

Alluding to District Attorney Jim Garrison of New Orleans, Mr. Hoover stated that Mr. Garrison was a disgrace to the office which he holds, and Mr. Lacour expressed his opinion that Mr. Garrison's action was a fraud perpetrated on the public and was a national disgrace.

According to Mr. Lacour, he, Lacour, had word that Garrison wanted to see the Attorney General in March of this year. Lacour revealed that he had told the Attorney General that he thought there was a complete lack of bona fides in Garrison's investigation and, accordingly, advised the Attorney General that if Garrison wanted to contact the Attorney General he thought he should do so through Mr. Lacour's office.

Both Mr. Lacour and the Director were in complete accord as to the disgraceful nature of Mr. Garrison's

publicity-seeking antics and of Mr. Garrison's efforts to find a scapegoat on which to lay the blame for the ineffectiveness of his blundering investigation of the Assassination of President John Fitzgerald Kennedy.

Mr. Lacour and his family posed for a photograph with the Director. Immediately after meeting with the Director, Mr. Lacour and his family were given a special tour of the Exhibits Section, the Laboratory, and the Indoor Range.

At the termination of the tour, Mr. Lacour expressed his appreciation for the very courteous and special treatment accorded him and his family. He particularly asked that his deep appreciation for the opportunity afforded both him and his family to meet with the Director be made known to the Director.
