ard V. Burnes declared. FRIDAY, Garrison's office filed bribery charges, against National Broadgasting Cor-newsman Walter Sheridan. The charges against both Sheridan and Townley grew

out of their activities prior to the airing June 19 of a nationally televised program which was highly critical of

the DA's inquiry.

Sheridan was charged with attempting to bribe key state witness Perry R. Russo of Baton Rouge in an effort to influence his testimony.

Townley was charged with attempting to bribe Russo by

offering him:
"1. Lodging in a residence in the state of California.

"2. Guarantee by National Broadcasting Co. of employment or job security in the state of Louisiana or the state

of California.
"3. Payment of the fee for the legal services of an attorney for extradition proceedings or in any other proceed(Mount Clipping in Space Below)
