For the information of each office, James Herbert Martin was resident manager at the Six Flags Inn at the time of the assassination. Martin subsequently invited Marina Oswald and her two children to share his home for several weeks following the assassination. Martin also served as business manager for Marina Osyald until she discharged him in late 2/64. Bufiles disclose that James Herbert Martin testified before Warren Commission on 2/27/64. His testimony is set out on pages 2 469 through 502 of Volume 1 of the Warren Commission Hearings. through 502 of Volume I of the Warren Commission Hearings and Copies of the Bearings are in possession of all PBI offices. The Tampa Office should carefully review the testimony of Martin as set out in the Warren Commission Hearings mentioned above. Thereafter, the Tampa Office should contact James Herbert Martin and obtain from him all pertinent data concerning the assassination which he has not testified to before the Warren Commission. If Martin does not volunteer information concerning the allegations he reportedly, furnished to Hartin should be pinned down A as to whether he has made such allegations to anyone. Of particular interest are the allegations attributed to Martin concerning Marina Oswald as set out on page two of Tampa's letterhead memorandum block dated 6/21/67. Results of Tampa's interview with Martin in this matter should be premptly forwarded to the Bureau in letterhead some suitable for dissemination. Las (89-43)
