**ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT

Enclosed is a copy of a memorandum dated July 11, 1967, at Dallas, Texas, which sets forth information furnished to our Dallas Office by Mr. William James Lowery, Jr.

For your additional information in this matter, Mr. Lowery previously contacted our Dallas Office on January 4, 1964. Mr. Lowery is a former member of the Communist Party. He has testified for the Government before the Subversive Activities Control Board.

On January 4, 1964, Mr. Lowery informed our Dallas Office that he had been contacted by Earl Lively, Jr., of Dallas, Texas. According to Lowery, Lively was then writing an anticommunist book which stressed the Fair Play for Cuba Committee connections of Lee Harvey Oswald. Lively's purpose in contacting Mr. Lowery was to obtain assistance from Lowery in the writing of his book.

[REDACTED] On July 10, 1967, Lively contacted Lowery and reported that he, Lively, had been in contact with people in the "Southeast" which Lowery understood to mean District Attorney Jim Garrison. Lively told Lowery that he had informed someone from Garrison's office that possibly Lowery could be of assistance to Garrison. Lowery informed the Dallas Office on July 10, 1967, that he has never known Lee Harvey Oswald or Jack Ruby and has no information of his own knowledge that would in any way contribute to establishing a conspiracy to kill President Kennedy.
