**ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT
JOHN FITZGERALD KENNEDY
NOVEMBER 22, 1963,
DALLAS, TEXAS**

Reference is made to the letter of Assistant Attorney General Fred M. Vinson, Jr., to this Bureau dated June 29, 1967, requesting that this Bureau locate and interview Mrs. Phyllis Nachman (phonetic), who reportedly was a twin sister to Phil Schultz, now deceased.

Attached is a copy of a memorandum dated July 11, 1967, at Milwaukee, Wisconsin, which sets forth results of our interview with Mrs. Phyllis Mary Nachman in this matter. Inasmuch as Mrs. Nachman stated that to her knowledge her brother, Phillip James Schultz, never used any names other than his own and that the names of Clem or Clay Bertrand were unknown to her, no further action is contemplated by this Bureau in this particular inquiry.

A check of our files disclosed no additional information concerning Phillip James Schultz to that which has already been furnished to you.

NOTE:

Dean Andrews, is the individual who claims he was contacted by Clay Bertrand 11/23/63 at which time Bertrand allegedly requested Andrews to go to Dallas, Texas, and defend Lee Harvey Oswald. We have been advised by the Department that Andrews now claims Bertrand is identical to Gene Davis, owner of Wanda's bar in New Orleans. Davis, [REDACTED] has denied ever using any alias, including Clem or Clay Bertrand. Davis indicated Phil Schultz, now deceased, reportedly used the name Clay Bertrand at one time in New Orleans. Davis stated Schultz is now deceased. We contacted Schultz's sister, Mrs. Nachman, in Minocqua, Wisconsin, and she was able to furnish no information indicating her brother, Phil Schultz, ever used the name Clay or Clem Bertrand. This completes our inquiry in this matter. By letter dated 7/5/67 we informed the AG that Davis had denied he was the mysterious "Clay Bertrand." We also informed the AG we would attempt to locate and interview Mrs. Nachman (phonetic).
