## INFORMATIVE NOTE

Date 7/12/67

Due to the great amount of publicity afforded the arrest of Clay L. Shaw by Jim Garrison on a charge of conspiracy to assassinate John F. Kennedy, Judge Edward A. Haggerty issued orders forbidding anyone connected with the case to make any public statements or cause further publicity.

In spite of these orders, publicity has been given to every development of the case and the biggest offender in his unquenchable thirst for greater publicity has been Jim Garrison.

Public statements have been made by other prominent figures in the case including Garrison's former aide, who has now publicly condemned Garrison. During recent NBC and CBS television coverage, statements were made by various of Garrison's witnesses, all of which statements would appear to fall within the scope of Haggerty's order.

The information in attached will not be disseminated, inasmuch as it is taken from news media material.
