Subpena DA, State Aides, Grand Jurors

Subpenas to appear at a hearing on a motion to quash the subpena for newsman Walter Sheridan to appear before the Orleans Parish Grand Jury were issues today to all grand jury members, District Attorney Jim Garrison, some members of his staff and

others. Sheridan, who has been charged with public bribery by Garrison's office in connection with the DA's Kennedy assassination probe, is a reporter for the National Broadcasting Co., which produced a documentary program critical of

the probe. The newsman, when subpenaed to appear before the grand jury, charged that Garrison is manipulating the jury to suit his own purposes.

HE THEN FILED a motion to quash the subpena of himself.

The date for the hearing on the motion has not yet been set. The subpenas issued today were issued for the persons to appear "when the hearing date is set."

In addition to the grand jury members and Garrison, subpenas have been issued to:
