(3) Pages S9826-S9830. Senator Hartke, (D) Indiana, pointed out that on June 25-28 the Columbia Broadcasting System presented what it designated as a "CES News Inquiry" entitled "The Warren Report." Mr. Hartke stated "This extensive inquiry, growing out of the controversy which has grown up to surround the Warren report and the entire question of the circumstances surrounding the assassination of President Kennedy, was a noteworthy undertaking by a major broadcasting network." He requested to have printed in the Record the text of the first of this four-part program and advised he would insert the other three parts at a later date. This material contained references to the FBI in connection with the investigation of the assassination of President Kennedy.
