INFORMATIVE NOTE

Date July 26, 1967

Dean Andrews is the New Orleans attorney who has told a number of conflicting stories regarding Clay Bertrand. Initially Andrews claimed Bertrand accompanied Lee Harvey Oswald to Andrews' office in the Summer of 1963. Andrews has changed his story a number of times, recently alleging Gene Davis, [REDACTED] was identical to Bertrand. Davis denied this. Very recently Andrews informed news media Clay Bertrand is a fictitious individual he invented. Andrews has been indicted on two occasions by New Orleans Grand Jury in connection with Garrison's investigation for perjury.

By letter dated June 29, 1967, the Department requested we interview Dean Andrews. By letter dated July 5, 1967, we informed Department we felt such interview by this Bureau not desirable since it would place us squarely in Garrison's investigation. Attached letter from the Department reports Department concurs with our belief that Andrews not be interviewed at this time.
